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What many underestimate: How many legacy contaminants still lie dormant deep in our soils. Germany, Austria, Switzerland and Spain each invest around 100 million every year to protect soils and groundwater from these old toxins - so that what comes out of your tap today doesn't exceed limit values.

Prevention is better than limit values - that's why we recommend filtering water at home.

An overview: What countries invest Germany Around 200-300 million € per year (public + private) for legacy contamination alone - without other soil protection measures.

Austria About 80 million € annually to protect soils and groundwater from legacy contamination.

Switzerland Around 100 million CHF/year (~100 million €) flow into legacy site remediation including protection of groundwater & soils.

Spain EU Environmental Agency estimates range from 50-100 million € annually in public funds (national + regional). Private investments from industry are added on top - usually in similar amounts, but difficult to capture precisely.
